Word From Our Pastor Jason Thomas

It was time for a service revolution. Two of Jesus' closest disciples stood by while their mother went to Jesus asking for her sons to be given special positions in God's kingdom. When the other disciples learned of what James and John wanted, they became indignant with

them. Jesus, then, called them all together and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. It shall not be so among But you. whoever would be great among you, must be your slave, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Matt. 20:25-28). Jesus taught with words and demonstrated with action that He and his followers must cease being "I want" followers and instead become "I will" servants.

The same is true for you and I. It is time for a service revolution. Think about your own attitudes about church. Are you an "I want" follower or an "I will" follower? This is a good question to prayerfully consider this week. Together, let's pray for God to give us servant hearts that are focused on helping others instead of helping ourselves. Let's pray for each other and ask God for opportunities to serve. If He opens that door, will you give Him one hour of service each week for the rest of the year? Together we can! Worship & More...

How do you worship? I am asking that question for all of us to have a look at ourselves. And, I am asking that question in two different ways...

In terms of *practice*, what do you do while you worship? God's Word is full of examples of *how* to worship: Standing (Ps 24:3); Singing (Rom 15 9); Instruments (Ps 150: 3,4,5); Lifting Hands (Ps 134:2); Shouting (Ps 100:1); Kneeling (Phil 2:10); Bowing/Prostrate (Ps 95:6); Clapping (Ps 47:1). (These are just a few of the practices of worship listed in God's Word.)

In terms of *passion*, what do you do while worshipping? Are we giving our *whole heart* to the practice of worship of our Lord? Is our heart *connected* to God's heart as we worship, or are just going through the motions? Do we prefer to be "sung to" by someone rather than "singing to" the Lord?
