Word From Our Pastor Jason Thomas

Jesus promises us great staying power when we listen to His voice and follow Him. "Mv sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand" (John 10:27-28).

> Your life in His hands begins the moment you first believe, and He has promised you great staying power! The guestion becomes, are you letting His power work in your life to produce patience and perseverance? In his book, Will, Thom Rainer addresses a

problem that has become too common in our churches today... Church drop out. There are a variety of reasons why people drop out, but they usually involve disappointment, hurt feelings, or burnout.

Thom's advice is simple, but also very helpful. Find your place of service and stick to it based on a desire to please God. If you are seeking to please people or yourself, you will often burn out or experience hurt feelings. If you are not involved, you will often miss out and eventually fade away. Above all, remember this... God already has a plan for your service. "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Eph. 2:10). We are saved, not by our works, but to do good works! See you this Sunday after a week in His harvest field! -Jason
