Word From Our Pastor Jason Thomas

Are you hoping for victory this season? You will find victory in the words we read this past Sunday in Luke 1:38, "May it be to me as you have said." In those words. Mary was opening her heart and mind to the Holy Spirit, who would pour into her life with the power of the Most High. Through this power, what at

first was impossible for Mary in her own strength, would become possible with God.

So often, you and I seek victory in our own strength. Take for example the common tendency this time of year to eat too much chocolate (of which I am very guilty). What if you made a rule that you will not eat anymore chocolate. You then commit yourself to obeying this rule,

only to discover that it does not set you free from the underlying desire for chocolate. Your new rule actually seems to make the desire even stronger. What will you do then?

This is where God teaches us to live each day by the power of His Spirit.
