Word From Our Pastor Jason Thomas

You can make a difference! In the final chapter of his book, I Will, Thom Rainer shares the story of what God did in 1857 through the faith of one man. This man. Jeremiah Lanphier, was not a professional minister. He was a middleaged merchant with no pastoral experience. Yet, he had a vision to see

his city turn back to God through repentance and prayer.

Though he handed out over 20,000 flyers in NYC, only 6 people came to the first prayer meeting. Then 23 the next week. Though the group was small, the presence of God was very powerful. Rainer writes, "Those who were in the meetings decided to have the gatherings every day. And the numbers continued to increase. By winter of 1857, the prayer meetings were filling three large churches everyday. Then, by March 1858, every available public hall and church in NYC was filled every day." An amazing prayer movement had begun!

God works powerfully through simple beginnings. Remember what God told Abram in Genesis 15:5, when Abram was already older and still without children. "He took him [Abram] outside and said, 'Look up at the heavens and count the stars - if indeed you can count them... So shall your offspring **be.**" Though he could not see what God was saving. Abram believed what God was saying. And through his faith, God not only built a nation, but also provided a Messiah who was and is building the Body of Christ!

Through your faith, you can make a difference. Together, let's faithfully say "I will" and dare to believe what God will do! See you this Sunday after a week in the Harvest field!
