Word From Our Pastor

After watching the evening news last night, I turned off the television with one question in mind... "Where did all of this conflict come from?" It is not just on TV either. If we are honest, it is happening much closer to home, from time to time, in our personal relationships. Though we

might not call these conflicts,

"wars," the truth is that there

is a war raging inside each

one of us. This first declaration of war is found in our origin at Genesis 3:16. "To the woman he [God] said. ...'Your desire will be for your husband, and he will rule over you." This desire is more than physical attraction. The word God used

means to jockey for position in a personal power play, to which the man responds with an attempt to rule over. The result has been and still is an ongoing tug of war with personal desires competing and often waging war at the heart of our human relationships. The brother of Jesus would later describe it this way... "What causes fights and quarrels

among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within?" (James 4:1).

When our relationships are driven by the desires within, the result is that self is in the center. When self is in the center, then God is not in the center. The peace we need in our relationships will only happen if God is in the center. When you experience conflict this week, look in the mirror at vour own desires and then look to the Holy Spirit. First find peace with God by letting God win, and then you can seek to share His peace with the other person. See you this Sunday after a week in His harvest field! -Jason

Discipleship

At first glance, it appears a honorable thing that Jesus' disciples kept such careful guard over the orthodoxy (correct doctrine) of Jesus' ministry. They found someone casting out demons in Jesus' name who was not a part of their group and not under their control, and they demanded that he stop. Yet it was Jesus who saw through His disciples' hypocrisy. The disciples themselves had been given the power to drive out demons as well (Matt. 10:8), yet they had failed miserably (Mark 9:28). Here are two things they missed: Jesus alone defines orthodoxy, and His disciples must focus on orthopraxy (correct conduct).

How it must have embarrassed the disciples to have publicly failed to cast out a demon from a young boy. Yet, here was someone successfully exorcising demons who was not even regularly with Jesus as they were. They should have been concerned with their own lack of spiritual vitality. They should have felt

convicted by their Lord's stinging rebuke at their lack of faith (Matt. 17:20). Instead, this led them to focused on others (a "us vs. them" mentality). Rather than repenting and grieving over their spiritual impotence from a neglected othopraxy, the disciples attempted to hinder someone who was enjoying spiritual success. The sneaky chaos of sin expanded its tentacles.

At times, it is easier to diminish others' spiritual victories than to honestly confront our own failures. This is not the mind of Christ. Jesus' response to His disciples must have surprised them as He said, "Do not forbid him" (Mark 9:39). He assured them that "he who is not against us is on our side" (Mark 9:40). Are you able to genuinely rejoice in the spiritual victories of others? The Spirit

> of the Lord brings unity and kinship in a completely different reality!

Zechariah 14:9 says: The Lord will be king over the whole earth. On that day there will be one Lord, and his name the only name.
