Word From Our Pastor

Take the opportunity to go deeper! In part 3 of our 5 part look at strengthening our "parental" influence, let's consider the opportunity to go deeper. Jesus always had a way of speaking to the crowds, but then taking the conversation deeper with his closest

disciples. On one occasion, this was the conversation:

> "Who do people say the Son of Man is?' They replied, 'Some say John the Baptist: others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets. 'But what about you?' he asked, 'Who do you say I am'" (Matt. 16:13-15)? Asking good questions

Jason Thomas will jump start good conversations with our kids. And notice in this particular conversation that Jesus encouraged his disciples to recognize other views. Often, we might frown on considering what others might say about Jesus. But know this, our kids will be exposed to other world views and what others are thinking about Jesus. Don't be afraid to talk about other world views, but instead, take the initiative to learn some about them yourself and help your kids process them in a way that leads them to this most important and personal question: "Who do vou sav I am?" Our kids need to see a bigger picture and be led with love, consistency, and

themselves who Jesus really is. If you've never answered that question for yourself, let this be the right moment for you. Then you will be ready to model and lead your kids to know Jesus for themselves. We will celebrate those moments this Sunday morning! -Jason

Discipleship

Your "cross" is God's will for you, regardless of the cost. Taking up your cross is a choice; it is not beyond your control. One of the most beautiful and mysterious facts of the passion is that Christ willingly took it on. This is a fact that requires long absorption to fully impact our hearts. You may have health problems or a rebellious child or financial pressures, but do not mistake these as your "cross to bear." Neither circumstances you face nor consequences of your own actions are your cross. Your cross will be to voluntarily participate in Christ's sufferings as He carries out His redemptive purposes (Phil. 3:10). Paul said he rejoiced in his sufferings because he knew that by them he was able to participate in the suffering required to bring others into Christian maturity (Col. 1:24). I am sure this only occurred after much submissive prayer, fasting and worship.

We tend to want to go immediately from "denying ourselves" to "following Jesus." But you really cannot follow Jesus unless

you have first taken up your cross. There are aspects of God's redemptive work that can be accomplished only through suffering. Yes, suffering that is willingly taken on. Just as Christ had to suffer in order to bring salvation, there will be hardships you may have to endure in order for God to bring a clear picture of himself to those around you. Jesus did not talk with His disciples about the cross until they had come to know He was the Christ (Matt. 16:21). You will never be able to endure the suffering of the cross unless you have first been completely convinced that Jesus is the Christ. Once you have settled your relationship with Christ, He will introduce you to your cross.

There is no Christianity without a cross. If you are waiting for a relationship with God that never requires suffering or inconvenience, then you cannot use

Christ as your model. God's will for you involves a cross. First, take up your cross; then you can follow Him. May we willing take His will for our lives on and carry on.

How can we make gathered Sunday worship is a place celebrate, instead of a place to get "filled-up"? First, I believe that gathered Sunday worship should be a culmination of our personal worship throughout the week. Here is what I do during the week:

Daily Time Alone With God: This is worship time (for Him), not bible study time (for me). begin my day using God's Word to worship, praise & pray, and to give all of my attention to Him, not to me (my needs, wants, and

Listening To Worship Music: What better way to spend my driving time, running, manual work (mowing, etc.), and "down" time than worshipping the Lord musically. Music that doesn't exalt Him pretty much stays off my playlist.

Sabbath Preparation: We can learn from the Hebrew people who worshipped from sundown to sundown. Years ago our family adopted a Simplify Saturday Evening lifestyle, where we use Saturday evenings to prepare for Sunday worship: Minimal social commitments, relaxed/stress-free

atmosphere at home, Sunday preparation (choosing of clothes, locating Bibles, etc.), and early to bed.

Worshipping To Prepare For Worship: My Sunday mornings begin with worship (just like the other days of my week). I don't wait until I enter the Worship Center to worship, but worship in preparation for worship, and on the way to worship.
