Life with kids is hectic! I find myself struggling to meet everyday demands, with having to juggle school, work, sports, and other extracurricular activities. It makes it nearly impossible to include daily family devotions and prayer time. Do we have our priorities in order? Are we relying on the church to guide our kids to form a relationship with Jesus and trust in the in Lord, just by attending Sunday School?

Let me give you some statistics. Between the day your child is born, and the day he or she turns 18, there are 940 Sundays! Let's say she is already 5 and in kindergarten, you are down to 680, and by 5th grade you only have 420 Sundays left!!! If we really want our kids to build a solid relationship with Jesus Christ, we are going to have to do better than this!

What I want to accomplish is to build a Family Ministry that unifies teachers and parents. Let's partner together in the disciple making process of our kids! I want there to be an open line of communication between parents, teachers, and kids that reflect the value of relationships we are trying to create. I want us to not only lay out a biblical foundation for our kids, but give them the skills they need to tell others about the love of God!

Let's put focus on missions and outreach since we are commanded to love one another, be kind, and take care of each other. Throughout the end of the year, our Kid's Ministry will be having several opportunities to get involved in, both family activities and outreach events. I encourage you to participate and talk to your kids about why we do these things. Communication is the first step in building trust with your kids! I look forward to working with you through this disciple making journey!



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# Embrace the Vision & Heart of Family Ministry

Our Church is growing towards an integrated way of investing into the lives of our kids and students. The possibility exists that kids can get lost in the wide path of growing up in the church and miss the essential life-giving emphasis they need for the next stage. We want to be very intentional in the values that influence our children with who we believe God to be. We also acknowledge the inherent complexities of parenting and building a Jesus-focused perspective. We view the family ministry of the church to be a partner with parents who are the primary disciple maker for the kids and students. So we want to work with you as much as them and not simply about behavioral issues but their spiritual progress. We want environments that are more than one trained minister and group of students, but include as many mentors as teachers. Here are the four values that we want to emphasis and cultivate as we partner together with the parent from birth to 18 years of age:



What you may notice as you read those are that they all apply to the heart or perspective of a student and how they interact with their world. Our students' heart and their relationships are the exact things we are aiming to influence. We say it this way. We are unified in the desire for hearts and relationships to flourish between God and people.

So why change from a children and youth ministry focus to a family ministry focus? We believe that parents have the privilege to be the primary disiciple maker in the life of a child. We believe this is deeply scriptural. If we ignore this and do not include them in the ministry effort, we see a vast array of problems that come to the surface. We can not ignore the fact that a church ministry may have Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings, but parents have the students everyday and a special 1:1 impact. Here are 4 areas we want to subtly shift towards more parent involvement in what we do.

#### Communication

# Summer Missions Camp

Our Kids and Students Camps are amazing highlights each summer. They enrich each student with an experience of other-orientation, worship and revival. We want to partner with families to make this opportunity available to as many students as possible. It is a major financial commitment from the families and our church ministry. We seek ways to offset the cost by hosting 8 fundraiser lunches on the first Sunday of every month except Jan. Our kids and students participate in its preparation, service and clean up and receive credit that applies to their camp costs. This is how we make camp the experience of majority and not the minority. We need the parents'/guardians' help and commitment to get the kid or student to church at 9am on these Sundays. They will be dismissed approximately at 1:30pm as clean up wraps up. 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#### Clubhouse Friends

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On Wednesday evenings, we offer a dynamic program designed for kids' kindergarten-5th grade called 'Clubhouse Friends'. We meet upstairs in the large room of the kids' wing (called The Clubhouse) at 6pm and start off the night with a craft or game before leading into Large Group time. During large group, the kids say the club pledge, memory verse, and are introduced to the lesson by watching one of our On-Location videos, and then gather in small groups. Small group discussions are initiated through our 'Explore the Bible' lessons and offer plenty of time for both teacher led and student interactions. We wrap up the night at 7:10 with a large group game or activity! Kids should be picked up at 7:15. We also offer a preschool Bible study downstairs for babies-preK4. Kids are taught Bible stories through stories, songs, play, and crafts. Join us each Wednesday as we build relationships, dig into the word, and learn about missions and outreach!

#### **Family Ministry is Transition Ministry.**

One thing that we have noticed is that traditionally there are two points where students have great difficulty with the church: (a) Transitioning from the children's department to the youth department (b) Graduation and the transition to what's next. We want to do more than turn our attention to these changes during "Move Up Sunday," but to work in the reality that change is a major part of growing up. The drastic changes that kids make as they grow must be central to what we do. If we can focus our efforts on transitionsm, it will help us develop appreciation for new people and bring new people into our ministry continually and naturally.
