What is a vocation? You may recall from last week that it was God who gave the first job to the first human being. "The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to cultivate it and take care of it" (Gen. 2:15). Perhaps it was a surprise to see that the first job

Worship & More... I recently asked this question of my friends: When is a good time to

praise God? Some responses: When things are going good. On Sundays during gathered worship. When my "team" wins. I believe that there is a much simpler answer. The best time to praise God is always.

Psalm 92:1-2 says it well: It is good to praise the Lord and make music to your name, O Most High, proclaiming your love in the morning and your faithfulness at night. How should we begin our day? Praising God! How should we spend the time while we are eating our meals? Praising God! What should we do when something good happens to us? Praise God! What should we do when something bad happens to us? Praise God! (I Thessalonians 5:13 Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.)

I think we get the picture. Praising God should be happening always. Which leads us to the idea of activity vs. lifestyle. An activity is something we do either periodically or regularly, with definite starting and stopping points. (Shopping, football game, TV show, social media engagement...) A lifestyle is something that we practice always. It is a part of us. I defines us.
