Word From Our Pastor Jason Thomas

performing this week in her elementary school drama and I am sure it will be awesome as well). And here's the point, because God is doing some really good things in and through our Church Family, we should be excited to go and tell new people about them! As we take this next step in our newsletter series on Growing Pains,

the key word is "Go!" Go is one of our major platforms for being a church that connects well with people who are un-churched. Wouldn't it be amazing if every member of our church family became a faith multiplier by connecting with new people and sparking a healthy curiosity about Jesus? One of the ways we can become that is simply by inviting others to Sunday morning.

Consider these "Go Tips" this week: (1) Begin to see every person in the community as important to God; (2) Smile and be friendly as you engage with others; (3) Use our "Be My Guest" cards to offer a friendly invite; and (4) Come to the book study I am leading on Wednesday nights at 6:30 pm where we are learning a more personal, conversational approach to sharing our faith. Discipleship

One of our greatest preventions of sin is the life of another Christian. Much of the discussion, I believe gets a bad stigma because of the actions of a few. But this aspect of our faith must be redeemed if we are to live in community well. Some Christians maintain that it is none of their business if another chooses to sin. They are convinced that they are being judgmental if they respond to someone. But love risks and apathy is never the answer. The world persuades them not to get involved, but this inaction prevents us from being effective. But what if our words of encouragement and wisdom flow so naturally from our hearts that we become magnets for Christ.

Sin kills relationships, dismantles lives, stifles joy, and destroys peace. When we see someone wandering, how should we respond? When Jesus saw the love of pride, power, and position, it broke His heart. He praved fervently for His disciples to be strong when their hearts

strayed (John 17). He warned those who were heading toward spiritual failure. Do not underestimate the power of positive investment. Jesus was even willing to die to save people to reveal an alternative way of pride, power and position. Jesus never stood idle as those around Him were led astray. Jesus engaged. He always took an active role in turning them back to a genuine picture of God.

"Minding your own business" will save you some discomfort, but it will not help a brother or sister who needs to the Lord. Love, encouragement, concern are always expressing a concern for their relationship with God. Pray fervently for your friends and family and ask God to safeguard your motives and prepare you to minister. Be alert, in the event that God asks you to address your

friend. If you do so, be loving and gentle lest you, too, be tempted (Gal. 6:1).
