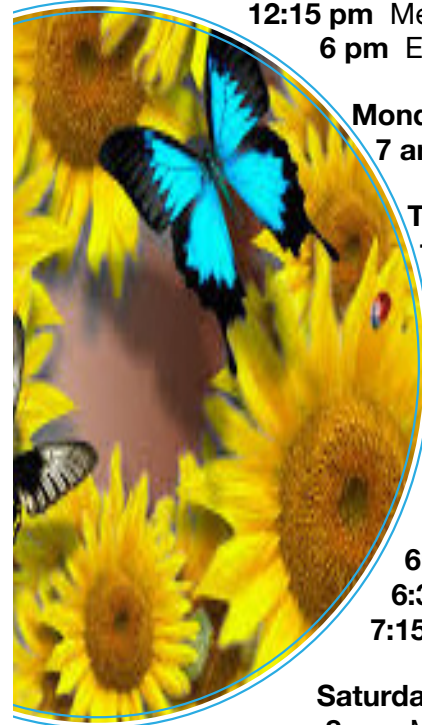

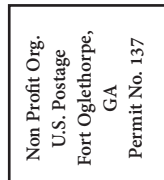

Imagine the experience. It is a day and time that you usually have for yourself. You are not used to thinking about spiritual things at this time, much less going to a worship service.
