Worship & More...

Last week in this space I began to answer the question, "Why do we occasionally repeat words and phrases in worship?" I began the discussion by referencing scripture, and noting many of the classic hymns that we love (see last week's FBCFO Newsletter, July 18-25).

Another reason it is important to repeat words and phrases is because emphasis is needed to drive home a point. The apostle Paul used this practice for emphasis in Philippians 4:4: Reioice in the Lord always: again I will say, Rejoice, and in Galatians 6:11: "See with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. ("large letters" for emphasis). Jesus Himself used repetition multiple times when he taught, such as in John 3:3: Truly, truly I say to you ...

In life, we often repeat words and phrases for emphasis: When speaking to our children, when talking about a meal we enjoyed, when making a political comment, and when shouting at a football game. It is how we communicate: We repeat words
