Word From Our Pastor

Be honest with me! Welcome back to our series on getting "smaller" in classes & small groups. As we take this next step, consider the importance of honesty in your groups. Do you have close enough relationships with people who can be honest with you?

Last week we looked at how Jesus called twelve ordinary men to be with Him in what we should call a small group. This was

> God's way of preparing these men to launch the early church after the resurrection. Think about the 2 to 3 years that they shared in a close relationship with Jesus. Do you think Jesus was honest with them?

> > Some of us might say that honesty first requires that we

have our own lives in order before we can help a fellow group member. And while it is true that we should heed the "planks" in our own eye before seeking to remove a speck in our neighbor's eve (see Matthew 7:5), we need to share a basic understanding that we all have "planks" and we all need others to help us deal with them. Mutual humility and a common motive of love must be included to make honesty work well without defensiveness. And that is why God tells us to speak the truth to each other in love so that "we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is Christ" (Eph. 4:15).

Honesty is necessary, but it is also a privilege of a close relationship. Ask God to help you find the right person(s) whom you can give an open invitation to speak truth into your life. Seek to get "smaller" with a few trusted group members for trust, confidentiality and, yes more candid honesty. Through these honest relationships, we will grow up into Him! -Jason

Discipleship

Jeremiah was invited by God to be a weeping prophet. From one perspective this is heavy burden but from another it was a privilege to express God's heart for His people. His message was bigger than His words, but he himself was expression of the mind and heart of God. His call came during turbulent, agonizing times as his society suffered from pervasive spiritual decay. The nation of Judah had turned so far from God that it was soon to face His fierce judgment. This was not a time for rejoicing but for weeping. God looked for someone He could mold into the kind of prophet needed for such a bleak time. He found Jeremiah. The cost to Jeremiah was intense: he sacrificed much of the freedom of his youth in order to be God's messenger. He forfeited family and reputation. He endured

misunderstanding, ridicule, and persecution. He was imprisoned and mocked by those to whom he had come to warn of God's impending

actions. He was shaped to focus not on the results of His ministry, but being a revelation of the heart of God.

Satan will try to convince us that obedience carries much too high of a price, but he will never tell you the missed opportunities of not obeying God. If we are to be used in God's service, we must expect to make adjustments in our life. Don't be deceived into thinking there is no cost involved in obedience.

What adjustments is God asking you to make? Will you face the hardships and opposition that will come when you align your life with God's will? Not only trust God, but also find the personal privilege you have been given to travel your journey. Jeremiah had the deep satisfaction of knowing he was a
