Word From Our Pastor

Do we share the same

heartbeat? In our area, Labor Day Weekend is always a special time because of one big thing... The start of college football season. And with each new season, our favorite teams take the field, playing different positions, but all sharing the same goal of weekly

victories and season

championships. The teams that are most successful are the ones who play their positions the best, but also do so with trust in their fellow teammates and a shared heartbeat that is greater than any one player.

> As we take this final step in our series on getting "smaller" in classes and groups, we pick up with the question from last

week: Have you become part of a disciple-making team? The most logical place to find this kind of team is with your current small group or class.

Assuming you have a class or group, what does a disciple-making team look like? The answer begins with leadership. Each group needs leadership that shares the same churchfamily heartbeat of being disciples who makes other disciples. This includes consistently encouraging the group to invite new people into a welcoming atmosphere. This includes a commitment to feeding each member with sound, biblical doctrine. This includes raising up new leaders who will become teachers and care leaders for launching new groups. And it also includes establishing consistent connections with the community through local ministry projects. Does this leadership exist? Before you consider your teacher, consider yourself You could be just the leader your group needs. All together for Jesus! -Jason

Discipleship

The first thing you do after God speaks to you is **critical**. Sometimes when are so excited to hear from God that we are not patient with how we respond. Jesus was telling Peter what type of ministry he would have and what type of death he would suffer (John 21:18-19). It was a sacred moment in Peter's life, as his Lord pulled back the curtain to his future. His was not to be an easy life but a life ordained and blessed by the Lord. Imagine what he wished he would have asked Jesus about later.

Rather than responding to what Jesus told him and processing His words, Peter looked around at his fellow disciples. His glance fell upon John, the disciple whom Jesus loved. "But Lord, what about this man?" Peter asked. Peter had just been given the somber news of his future death. How natural to compare his assignment with that of the others!

This is a

great temptation of God's people: to compare our situation with that of others. Did God give my friend a larger salary? Did God heal my friend's loved one and not mine? Did God allow my friend to receive appreciation and praise for his work while I remain anonymous? Did God allow another Christian to remain close to her family while I am far removed from mine? These are

thoughts we must develop an art of letting go of. Focus on the sacred words for us from Jesus.

Jesus assigned Peter and John to walk two different paths, but both Peter and John had powerful roles in life of the early Church. Jesus knew how dangerous it is when a servant takes his eyes off the master to focus on a fellow servant. (So did Peter, remember

> walking on water?) Where is your focus? Sometimes we have to learn somethings more than
