#### Word From Our Pastor Jason Thomas

So that more may know! You may have seen these numbers. If one pastor shared his faith with one person each week for a year, there is the hope of reaching 52 people. But what if a church family of 300 people came along side that pastor with the same heartbeat and mission? Then, the hope of

reaching 52 people would multiply to 15,652. And it gets better. If each one of those new 301 people from the first week shared their faith with others who shared with others, on a weekly basis, then the multiplication would begin. The numbers are staggering. By the end of 12 weeks. over 600.000 lives would be touched. Multiply that out another month to

16 weeks, and we are talking around 10 million lives, about the size of the population in Georgia!

Based on the numbers, the possibilities are great. Yet, practically speaking, we don't see anything remotely close to that kind of faith multiplication today. If it is ever going to happen, then it must begin somewhere. And I simply ask, why not here with you and me?

In this new article series, I will share some practical tips on how we can begin. We will be talking about how to share our faith in daily circumstances without being pushy or annoying. These are ways to be effective and also faithful. Will we reach 10 million lives and beyond? Truthfully, the results are not up to us. But we should do our best to make each day count for God's kingdom. Faith multiplication can happen. Remember the faithfulness of the early church. Through them, God "added to their number daily those who were being saved" (Acts 2:47). Stay tuned for more! -Jason

## Discipleship

All followers of Christ have the great task of ministry. Ministry is seeing a need then meeting a need. Ministry is costly. It requires compassion and sacrifice. When the heavenly Father wanted to save His creation from sin, He could find no other way except the sacrifice of His Son (Rom. 5:8). Scripture gives a stark picture of the price our Savior paid to obtain our salvation: "He is despised and rejected by men, A Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief" (Isa. 53:3). If Christ is our model for ministry, we cannot avoid going to the cross for the sake of others. This is a journey of compassion and sacrifice.

Salvation comes with a great price, and if we are going to "take up our cross" and follow Jesus, then we must be prepared to go with Him to the place of suffering if that's what it takes to bring salvation to those around us. It also requires compassion, Jesus saw

needs through the lens of empathic inclusion. Tax collectors, lepers and prostitutes all were brought in by the good news of Christ.

If our goal is to bring others to Christ we must be willing, as He was, to risk rejection. People may disappoint us, misunderstand our motives. Our Savior did not let suffering prevent Him from being used by God to bring the good news to those He loved. Love for His Father provided all the motivation that was necessary. Are you presently experiencing hardship because of the ministry to which God has called you? Have you begun to wonder if the price you are paying is too great? Take a moment to reflect on the price God was willing to pay in order to bring grace to

you. Are you glad He was willing to do what was necessary? Will you not join Him in whatever is necessary to bring relationship with Christ to those around you?
