

The power of Intentional Kindness! Welcome back to our

article series on how to become a faith multiplier without being pushy or annoying. So far, we've looked at some hard-to-believe numbers of what could happen if we shared our faith with others who, in turn, shared their

> faith with others on a weekly basis. And while the results

> > are up to God, we were encouraged last week to begin with prayer. Instead of first going

to others on behalf of God, we can start by going to God on behalf of others. There is power in prayer that intercedes on behalf of people who need Jesus!

> As we take this next step. consider the

power of intentional kindness. Jesus gave this new command to His original disciples who passed it down the line to us, "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:34-35).
