#### Word From Our Pastor Jason Thomas

The Art of Asking and Listening! Welcome back to our article series on how to become a faith multiplier without being pushy or annoying. So far, we've looked at the difference we can make when we tap into the power of prayer and intentional kindness. When we remember to pray

first and practice the art of intentional kindness, we will see all kinds of "doors" open up for greater gospel conversations. And as we take this next step and think about those conversations, we need to also remember the art of asking and listening. I don't know about you, but I have never convinced anyone to follow

## Jesus by winning an argument.

Though the facts may be on our side as believers, people are often pushed away when we start unloading a bunch of facts on them. The time for facts and biblical truth will come, but rarely at the beginning of a conversation. Consider instead, how you can use questions and good listening to prepare a person to receive the facts and truth.

This will take time and patience, but asking and listening are ways to prepare the "soil" for the "seeds" of the gospel. When someone says that they do not believe in Jesus or the Bible, instead of debating, ask questions to find out why they don't believe. Asking and listening will help you understand where a person is coming from and how you can help them think through why they don't believe and how to see things differently. And at the same time, you are demonstrating that you genuinely care, which will "earn" you the privilege of sharing the truth. -Jason

# Discipleship

The prophet Isaiah told the story of a man with a vinevard on a fertile hill. The man cultivated the ground and removed the stones so that nothing would hinder the vines' growth. He planted only the best quality vines. He built a tower in the middle of the vineyard so he could watch for wild animals and intruders. He constructed a wine vat so that he would be ready for the ripe grapes. Then he waited. Rather than producing good grapes, however, the vineyard produced worthless ones. God's provision, His protection, His patience has always been there.

The story illustrates the relationship between God and His people. God has done everything necessary for us to produce an abundance of spiritual fruit in our lives. He saved us when we were without hope. He gave us His Holy Spirit to produce fruit in our lives (Gal. 5:22-23). He removed our sin so that we are free.

We have direct access to God through prayer. Jesus said that to whom much is given, much is expected (Luke 12:48). God is at work in our lives. But how are we responding?

Sometimes when we feel flat and wondering where is God, we need to remember He has done His part and is waiting patiently. The story reminds me of how deer hunting season is coming. Is deer hunting as simple as finding a tree and waiting on a deer to pass? Is that all there is to it? Of course not! It requires scouting, planning, clearing firing lanes, camouflaging yourself, and having the right equipment to produce the desired result. Spiritually, God has done all of that for you and simply invites to come with Him and be still. then aim and fire to produce the life

He desires. His provision, His protection and His patience simply has to be trusted. Find encouragement in vour salvation and thank God for His total provision. -Andy

Colossians 2:8 instructs us: As Believers, everything we
