

Worship as Warfare.

There is a curious verse that begins Psalm 144: Praise be to the Lord my Rock, who trains my hands for war, my fingers for battle.

Did you know that God has called us to do battle for His Kingdom? Our duty as Believers is not to have our sins forgiven and then live our lives seeking pleasure until we are called to heaven. Rather, we are commissioned to be His warriors for the Gospel in this dark world. But our weapons are not traditional weapons of war. Our weapons are prayer and praise.

2 Corinthians 10:4 says: The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. Look back to Psalm 144, and you can see that it is a prayer, crying out to God to show Himself

strong to defeat the enemies of our lives.
