



Greater God Awareness! When the Ark of God was finally brought to Jerusalem, there was a moment of worship that captivated a young king named David. "David, wearing a linen ephod, danced before the Lord with all his might, while he and the entire house of Israel brought the ark of the Lord with shouts and the sound of trumpets" (2 Sam. 6:14-15). David was so in tune with the presence of God in that moment that he did not care what others around him were thinking or doing.

This captivation leads us into the third edition of our blog series on the seven BIG words for Worship. David would later use this third word over and over in Psalm 150. The word in its most familiar form is "Hallelujah." It comes from the Hebrew verb, "hallal," which means to set aside all inhibitions and be overcome with joy in the presence of God. Most often, you will see the word translated as "praise" in your Bible, but notice how it means so much more than that. Think back to how David danced before the Lord in Hallelujah with all his might. Though he was outside in view of the entire assembly of Israel, he became captivated with the power and closeness of God. He was not worried about the world around him. In other words, his awareness of God was much greater than his awareness of self and others.

What would make a mighty warrior king like David become so captivated with God awareness? Maybe he had an awareness of God's goodness and grace similar to the son in Luke 15:23-24. Consider that kind of personal awareness. What would it take for your God awareness to become greater than your self-awareness this Sunday in worship? -Jason

Who does God say that you are? Many Christians have a limited view of themselves. We have all heard people say, "I'm just a sinner saved by grace." Although that is true, the key word is just. A more accurate statement is, "I used to be a sinner saved by grace." The bible is full of descriptions of Believers that are much more than simply sinners saved by grace.

The bible says God is on our side, and we are Children of God, welcomed into His throne room, free from bondage, no longer slaves, mansion-dwellers, chosen by God, and on and on. God's people are His preserving agents for a world that is corrupted and degenerating because of sin. Cycles of destruction and violence upon humanity are at work in individuals as well as corporate masses. **Christ came to create a new humanity.** Your life is designed and commissioned by God to enhance a community and to preserve the kingdom of God as He expands it. "You are the salt of the world." There is deep significance today for lives that are in touch with the presence of Christ and involved in our community. But we have to embrace this privilege! The presence of Christ in you makes all that He is available to others. His salvation, wisdom and adoption can free an addict, mend a broken home, heal the pain of the past, restore a wayward child, and comfort a grieving heart. All of this is available to those around you as Christ expresses His life through you.

If we are blind to the presence of the Lord, however, Jesus said we are like salt that has lost its saltiness and is, therefore, good for nothing. None of God's saving grace and power can be dispensed through us to others. How do we test the "saltiness" of our lives? Look at our family. Are we preserving it and giving it flavor? Examine our workplace. Does joy and peace follow our activity? Observe our community. Is it a better place because we are involved in it? What about our church? The evidence that we have been used by God as a preserving agent is that things are becoming spiritually better around us. Do we bring inspiration and excitement to the kingdom of God? If people around us are deteriorating spiritually, we need to go to our Lord and allow Him to adjust our lives so that we can be used to help others find His Good News. Christ is creating a new humanity, so look through the lens of the kingdom of God and see how you can provide perseverance and flavor to His work!
