



You are an Instrument! The great prophet Elisha called for the harpist in 2 Kings 3:15, and while the harpist was playing, "the hand of the Lord came upon Elisha," and Elisha proclaimed that God would provide water in the Desert of Edom and lead Israel to victory over Moab. Imagine the harpist strumming his wooden instrument while Elisha proclaimed the Word of God. This was a powerful moment of worship that leads nicely into the fourth edition of our blog series on the seven BIG words for Worship.

Our big word for this edition is the Hebrew word, "zamar." It is found forty-one times in the Old Testament and means to experience the presence of God through the strumming of a musical instrument. It reminds us that music is a powerful medium that God can use to touch our souls in a way that few other things can. Think about a worship song or classic hymn that lifts you up and brings great joy to your spirit the moment you hear the first note. Music is one of those artistic mediums that helps you experience God in a close and powerful way.

Though not all of us actually play a musical instrument, the truth is that we all can be instruments for worship. Through faith in Christ, your body has become a temple for the presence of God (1 Cor. 3:16). And when you participate in a gathered worship experience, you unite together with other believers with the same Holy Spirit moving in and through everyone in a way that elicits harmony, rhythm, passion, momentum, and ultimately brings glory to God! You are a wonderful instrument, and when you place your life freely in the hands of God, He will produce a glorious sound! -Jason

Increasing Our Faith. We know that the Bible says it is impossible to please God without faith. And we as Believers want to please God. Therefore, faith ought to be at the forefront of everything we do. (Hebrews 11:6 says And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him.)

That being said, how can we increase our faith? Romans 10:17 says So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God. It doesn't say faith comes by hearing the Word of God once, or even a few times. The verb hearing implies constant and consistent exposure. It's hearing in the present tense, rather than the past tense.

By constantly and consistently exposing ourselves to God's Word, we transform and rearrange our minds to increase our faith, instead of living in doubt.

How do we do this? We need to read the Word, hear the Word, memorize the Word, speak the Word, and sing the Word. Every day we are accumulating a lifetime of exposure to nonbiblical ideas, philosophies, and culture. We need to push all of that aside and replace it with God's Word.

This will increase our faith, and ultimately we will please God. It's a battle, but well worth it... Worship Well! -Brad

pastor of discipleship & families - andya@fbcfo.org One of the paradoxes of the Christian life is that God's gifts often require effort on our part. God brought the Israelites to the Promised Land and told them He was going to "give" it to them (Num. 13:2). This sounded great to the Israelites until they realized that, with the gift, came battles against giants and fortified cities! God had work to do on their hearts in the process. Perhaps they assumed God was going to obliterate the inhabitants of the land before they entered. Ideally for the Israelites, they could then have entered a vacant land with houses and cities already built and ready to inhabit. Instead, God said they would have to fight for it. They would not have to fight in their own strength, however; God would be present to fight for them. God would bring down the walls of cities, give them strategies to defeat their enemies, and empower their warriors to fight. The Israelites would have a divine advantage over anyone they fought, but they would still have to fight. Bringing balance to this paradox in our lives takes experience and trust. Assumptions will be the enemy. Realize God's eyes are on the

heart even when our eyes are on the physical.

It would be wonderful if, when we surrender to Christ, that God would fill our minds with a complete knowledge of the Bible and with Bible verses already memorized. It would be easy if God would instill in us a delight for spending hours in prayer each day, a desire to share our faith with others and to love our enemies as our selves. But God doesn't relate to us that way. Instead, He gives us the free gift of His salvation and then tells us to "work out" our salvation in fear and trembling (Phil. 2:12). But don't be discouraged! God's gifts to you are perfect because, through them, He makes you perfect as well (James 1:17). He has also given you a spiritual family to walk through this together.
